Demand for Real Estate? Yep!

Even before Spring officially arrived, there was a lot of jostling and angling for housing going on in the Harrelson yard. As we watched all the activity, it seemed a good idea to add another birdhouse to the estate - we had 2 pretty new Bluebird boxes and one incredibly decrepit old box, and Tufted Titmice, Chickadees and Brown headed Nuthatches were almost colliding as each angled for a place to raise young. A storm in late January took out a Bluebird house and baffle that has previously been popular, and so we wanted to replace it.

We brought a box specifically designated for Titmice home with us, mounted it, and almost immediately saw Bluebirds flitting around it - according to both common knowledge and our bird knowledge, the smaller hole size of the Titmouse nesting box should have been discouraging to the Bluebirds, but ours didn't read the instructions, and promptly began building a nest in the box designed for smaller birds. We now have Bluebirds in place, but the others are still snooping around, so we're hopeful that some late starters will use the new box, as it's close by, but not too close (theoretically) - time will tell.

Cochran Mill Nature Center, which we often refer people to when they call looking for assistance with placing orphaned birds and animals, lost their mascot, a Barn Owl, and are seeking funds to replace that bird. To help, we are dedicating 10% of our sales on Saturday, April 21 to that end. The Nature Center has an estimated cost to replace the bird. which will come from Texas, and as a non-profit, they can always use all the help they can get. Creating a Productive Bird Habitat



The best way to improve the variety and number of birds in your yard is to include all the elements of a productive bird habitat.

Food

Offer a wide variety of bird foods in different kinds of feeders. Native plants that provide seeds, nectar, berries and other food sources are also very helpful in attracting more birds to your yard.

Matar

Birds need a dependable supply of water throughout the year for drinking and bathing. Many bird species that are not attracted to feeding stations are attracted to a reliable water source. Water is most attractive when it is audible and moving. Water sources can include small pools and waterfalls, bird baths, drippers, and misters.

Cover/Shelter

Birds won't come to a feeder or bath unless they feel secure. They need protective cover to escape predators and for rest. Native bushes and trees as well as small brush piles will give your birds the sense of security they need.

Nesting Locations

Trees, shrubs and other plants that provide shelter can also be safe nesting areas for non-cavity nesting birds. To entice cavity nesters, add nesting boxes around your yard. Provide nesting materials, such as string and yarn (2 to 4 inches long), feathers, bark strips, pine needles and pet hair, to make nest building a little easier.

- April 1 6: Project FeederWatch ends this month
- April 6: Full Moon, April 21: New Moon
- April 15 21: National Environmental Education Week
- April 21 22: Lyrids meteor shower
- April 22: Earth Day
- April 27: Arbor Day
- Whip-poor-wills arrive in the first half of the month.
- Wintering sparrows begin to head north; the White-throated are usually the last to go.
- Spring migration brings the Indigo Bunting, early in the month and the Yellow Warbler, Rose-breasted and Blue Grosbeak later.
- Mature male Rose-breasted Grosbeaks arrive about three days before the females. First year males usually arrive last.
